UMass Partnership

We partnered with UMass Dartmouth School of Nursing to submit a Letter of Inquiry to the Kendal Charitable Funds for a project to reduce isolation in the elderly population. Even if we don't get that invitation, we will continue to work with UMass Nursing students to enrich the lives of our members, while giving the students community interviewing and teaching experience. That group will work with our Executive Director and the Board to make sure our systems are operating efficiently, as well as help us to further refine the programs and activities to meet the needs of our members.
