Help with Vaccine Appointments

The hottest ticket this season is a covid-19 vaccine appointment! In early February appointments opened up for people age 75+ ... but Andy Pollock, our Executive Director, began hearing from members about their frustration in registering. Recognizing a real need, Andy and a group of Board members sprang into action, literally overnight. They collaborated with the Councils on Aging in Westport and Dartmouth and were able to register 50 members and friends for vaccination at Dartmouth High School! Linda and Tom Bush (pictured here) had struggled for days to find a vaccine location with open slots. "Coastal Neighbors was simply a lifesaver! We're so grateful," Linda said. As Massachusetts expands eligibility, Coastal Neighbors will monitor the situation and offer help when needed.

Welcome Westport! Our Village Grows

Folks in Westport had been hearing about a new organization that was helping Dartmouth residents stay comfortably in their homes. Could those services be expanded to Westport? They reached out to Coastal Neighbor's Executive Director Andy Pollock and Board President Steve Kiechel - the response was enthusiastic. Last September, after several months of planning, Coastal Neighbors officially expanded into Westport. Here's what it took to make it happen:

- Leadership by a core group of Westport residents who have deep experience in the community, many of them as leaders of other local service organizations: Chris Ash, Sarah Bartlett, Liz Brinkerhoff, Irene Buck, Nancy Culpepper, Dan George, Gay Gillespie, and Tony and Rosemary Melli.
- Close collaboration with the Westport Council on Aging and its Director, Beverly Bisch.
- **Strong support** from local organizations, such as the Westport Fire Department, St. John the Baptist Church and Westport Point United Methodist Church.
- Informational meetings at the Westport Grange before covid shutdowns and later via Zoom.
- **Personal outreach** by the core group members to seniors in Westport, resulting in new members, volunteers and donors.
- A celebratory picnic last fall to welcome Westport and bring people together.
- Westport members volunteering to serve: Gay Gillespie was appointed to the Board, and Westport members now serve on a host of committees, including Events, Fundraising, Membership, Nominating and Technology.

Winter Coats, Chocolate Hearts

- Coastal Neighbors members and friends donated 100 warm winter coats to Mobile Ministries in New Bedford, an organization that provides emergency food, clothing and shelter to local folks who need it.
- Our members were delighted when volunteers rang their doorbells to deliver Valentine's Day chocolate hearts, locally made by Dorothy Cox Chocolate of Fairhaven.
